Annelies Kusters is a deaf anthropologist and postdoctoral researcher at the Max Planck Institute of Religious and Ethnic Diversity in Göttingen, Germany.

In her presentation Annelies Kusters will discuss the manner in which travelers in Mumbai suburban trains are being compartmentalized based on gender, class, luggage type, and 'handicap'. In her research she focused on how passengers travelling in the compartments earmarked for 'handicapped people', try to create an inhabitable world and make the space livable for the duration of their trip.
